

If your child is ill or not able to come to school we need to know as soon as possible.



Behaviour, rewards and sanctions:

We expect good behaviour in school so that learning can take place and so that we can be a happy and safe school.

Good behaviour is rewarded with house points and letters home.

Poor behaviour is recorded and dealt with as explained in the school's Behaviour Policy. As a parent, you will be contacted by the class teacher if there is a serious incident. We call these a Red Alert. We also have Zero Tolerance Red Alerts for very serious incidents. We welcome discussion with parents if there is poor and/or persistent poor behaviour. We can also offer to support you if you are worried about your child's behaviour.

The school works closely with any child who has SEN. A range of programmes run across school to support children with their learning. Children with specific needs have an individual education plan to support them to make progress, The school works with parents as part of this process. School has a specialist provision for children with complex special needs. We call this bit of school 'RP'.
